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Introduction

- An idea is considered to have the potential value for the organisation and thus a project starts
- Idea is then developed into a viable investment proposition for the company how PM maintains the focus on objectives during the project



Purpose of the Business Case Theme


- Business Case theme establishes mechanisms to identify whether the project stays desirable, viable, and achievable
- This supports decision making during investment
- Projects aim to bring measurable improvements (benefits)
- PRINCE2 project delivers outputs (products)
- The use of products results in **changes to the business** (outcomes)
- Outcomes allow benefits realisation stipulated in business justification
- Business Case Theme implements the Continued Business
 Justification Principle







Outputs, Outcomes, and Benefits






It's important to note...


- Keywords to remember are:
 Desirable (balance of costs, benefits, and risks)
 Viable (able to deliver products)
 Achievable (whether use of products is likely to result in envisaged outcomes and resulting benefits)
- Business justification is usually documented in Business Case Document







Minimum Requirements for Applying This Theme



- A project must, as a minimum -
- create & maintain a business justification for the project; usually a business case
- review & update the business justification in response to decisions and events that might impact desirability, viability, or achievability of the project
- define the management actions that will be put in place to ensure that the project's outcomes are achieved and confirm that the project's benefits are realised
- define & document the roles and responsibilities for the business case and benefits management

Business Case


- Provides the costs, benefits, expected disbenefits, risks, and timescales against which viability is justified and continuing viability is tested
- You may use an alternative document to replace the business case for part of the project lifecycle

Benefits Management


 Defines management actions that will be put into place to ensure project outcomes are achieved and confirm the project's benefits are realised



Development Path for Business Case



- **Develop**: obtaining the right information upon which decisions can be made
- Verify: assess whether the project is (still) worthwhile
- Maintain: keep the business justification updated with costs, benefits, and current forecasts
- Confirm: assess whether intended benefits have or will be realised








Areas of composition within a Business Case Document (BCD)

- Issue Register








Reasons for unutilised products

- Project scope excludes benefits realisation
- Failure to fully understand objectives leading to product utilisation
- Commitment to changes introduced by the project is overtaken or fades
- Parts of the organisation were **never fully committed** to changes



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
